A LIMERICK RESPONSE TO REFUGEE / MIGRANT CRISIS: LIMERICK TO CALAIS

A group of volunteers will bring a convoy of aid from all over Ireland to Calais on September 30th. The volunteers will stay at the camp for a week as volunteers. A depot has been set up at the old *Cahill May Roberts* building, beside The Granary, Bank Place.

The agency that the group are working with, has requested a very specific list of items, as follows: •Heavy duty Rubbish bags •Four person Tents •Blankets •Sleeping bags •Candles, torches •Men's clothes: specifically, small to medium sized warm or waterproof clothes, including shoes and runners. •Men's toiletries, (two options):

Option 1: Men's toiletry bag to include Tooth paste, tooth brush, soap, two razors, one can shaving foam, pack of tissues in a medium sized durable bag. Option 2: any one of the above items boxed separately and labelled. •Tools for fixing bicycles, bicycle pumps and puncture repair kits. All donations should be in good, clean and dry condition. We ask donors to please sort and label as this will save a lot of work.

ACCORD is the Catholic organisation for the provision of Marriage Preparation Courses, and Marriage and Relationship Counselling for couples or individuals who are experiencing difficulties in their relationships.

Currently ACCORD is seeking volunteer 'Sitters' who would be present on their premises, at St. Munchin's College Corbally, Limerick, while counselling is being undertaking as, for insurance purposes, counsellors are not allowed to work in the building on their own with clients. Sitters would be required to attend once a week, times scheduled on a rota between 4.45pm and 8.30pm on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday evenings. Refugee Crisis

In the past year, 3,573 people have died attempting to reach Italy, Greece and Spain by sea, an average of ten people a day. This is both a humanitarian crisis and a crisis of humanity. The EU must apply humanitarian standards to save lives, protect those most vulnerable and reduce the scandalous suffering being met by refugees reaching European borders.

Trócaire is responding to the growing needs of extremely vulnerable refugees in partnership with Caritas Serbia and has allocated $\[\in \]$ 50,000 so far to provide sleeping bags and raincoats, hygiene kits, health services and psychosocial support. Trócaire also works with partners in Syria, Iraq, South Sudan and Somalia, which are burdened by protracted conflicts and in Jordan and Lebanon, countries which are hosting 1.75 million Syrian refugees.
