LET THE TAXMAN HELP

We ask that those who received a request to renew their income tax relief mandate would sign and return the forms at their earliest convenience. If you are a PAYE or Self-assessed taxpayer and donate $\[mathebox{\ensuremath{$\epsilon$}}250$ or more in one calendar year*, your donation can be worth up to 31% more to us. To allow us to claim the grossed up amount of tax associated with your donation we need your mandate. **Example:** A donation of $\[mathebox{\ensuremath{$\epsilon$}}250$ will be grossed up at 31% as follows: $\[mathebox{\ensuremath{$\epsilon$}}250$ X $\[mathebox{\ensuremath{}}100/69 = \[mathebox{\ensuremath{}}6362.32$ so the **tax refund** will be $\[mathebox{\ensuremath{}}6362.32 - \[mathebox{\ensuremath{}}6250 = \[mathebox{\ensuremath{}}6112.32$. A donation of $\[mathebox{\ensuremath{}}6500$ will be worth $\[mathebox{\ensuremath{}}6224.64$ and so on.

[*All donations that can be shown to have come from an individual in the course of the year, including those through the green (weekly) and yellow (monthly) envelopes, the Easter, Autumn & Christmas envelopes, and any other identifiable contributions, are taken into account.]
