Feb 1: Our hope is based in God for whom "nothing is impossible" (Lk 1:37). This hope enables #ConsecratedLife to keep writing its great history well into the future toward which the Holy Spirit spurs us, so that He can do great things with us.

Jan 31: With God at our side, we can overcome despair and live each moment as an opportune time to start again. In our worst moments, let us not close in on ourselves. May we talk to God about our pain and help each other to bear it.

Jan 30: Christian #Hope is greater than any situation in life, because hope has its foundation in God, not in other people. What seems impossible for human beings is possible for God (Mt 19:26).
